4.2. Posology and method of administration

<p>Posology</p> <p><i>Adolescents, adults and elderly</i></p> <p>a) single dose: 15-65 mg, one to three times daily</p> <p>daily dose: 45-105 mg (Note: maximum daily dose for ethanol-containing finished products: 67 mg; corresponding to 420 mg herbal substance)</p> <p>b) single dose: 14-18 mg three times daily</p> <p>c) single dose: 33 mg two times daily</p> <p>d) single dose: 100 mg three times daily</p> <p>e) single dose: 40 mg three times daily</p> <p><i>Children between 6-11 years of age</i></p> <p>a) single dose: 11-35 mg, two to three times daily</p> <p>daily dose: 33-70 mg. 4.3. Contraindications

Well-established use	Traditional use
<p>Hypersensitivity to the active substance or to plants of the Araliaceae family.</p> <p>Children under 2 years of age because of the risk of aggravation of respiratory symptoms.</p>	

4.4. Special warnings and precautions for use

Well-established use	Traditional use
<p>Persistent or recurrent cough in children between 2-4 years of age requires medical diagnosis before treatment.</p> <p>When dyspnoea, fever or purulent sputum occurs, a doctor or a pharmacist should be consulted.</p>	

Well-established use	Traditional use
<p>Concomitant use with opiate antitussives such as codeine or dextromethorphan is not recommended without medical advice.</p> <p>Caution is recommended in patients with gastritis or gastric ulcer.</p> <p>For extracts containing ethanol, the appropriate labelling for ethanol, taken from the 'Guideline on excipients in the label and package leaflet of medicinal products for human use', must be included.</p> <p>Preparation d) should not be administered to children under 6 years of age because of the alcohol content.</p>

4.9. Overdose

Overdose can provoke nausea, vomiting, diarrhoea and agitation. One case of a 4 years old child who developed aggressivity and diarrhoea after accidental intake of an ivy extract corresponding to 1.8 g herbal substance has been reported.
